The romantic comedy "Sea Marks" will open at the Pewter Plough Playhouse on Oct. 9 for a month's run on weekends. Tickets for the performances Friday and Saturday nights and Sunday matinees are now on sale at the playhouse.

Stars of the show are actress/novelist Mara Purl (known for her continuing role as Darla Cook on the NBC daytime drama "Days of our Lives") and actor Christopher Law ("One Life to Live" and the first male

spokesman for Revlon).

The production is being underwritten in part by donations to www.GoFund Me.com/seamarkscambria. Funds raised also will help the playhouse keep arts alive in Cambria.

Reviewers have deemed Gardner McKay's play as being touching, moving and hilarious.

It's the second time in as many years that the play will grace the Pewter Plough stage. Law and Purl portrayed the characters in 1984 and brought them

back to life three decades later. But unlike last year's presentation, which was delivered as a reading, this year's "Sea Marks" is a fully staged production.

Law plays a North Sea fisherman named Colm who's fallen in love with a Welsh woman he's seen just once — Purl's Timothea. Colm is no master of the pen, but despite this he sets out to court Timothea by writing her letters over a year and a half, finally succeeding in arranging a rendezvous.

To his surprise, she persuades him to live with her in Liverpool.

Purl, who's also a novelist, is a frequent visitor to Cambria who used the town as the touchstone for Milford-Haven, U.S.A., the setting for her povels, short stories and radio drama. Her novels have won multiple awards and ranked among the top five on Amazon in several genres.
